

Patient Link, Partner Link: What is the difference?

The difference between a patient link and a partner link is that, with a partner link, a partner record is created in the patient chart at the same (in addition to the SA's being visible in both charts, checklist linking, etc.) time. A patient link simply shows you the two charts are "linked" but nothing merged/combined in their patient data. Essentially it is just a visual link in the Patient Explorer folder tree.

Creating a Patient Link

A patient link is established by:

1 - right-click on a chart and select Patient Link

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2 - From the Patient Links window that appears, click Patient Link

3 – Enter all, or part, of the last name of the patient you want to link to. Click Search.

4 – Select the desired patient from the list that appears and click OK

5 – Click Done.

You will now see a '+Links' displayed under the patient's cycle. Clicking this will display the linked patient chart.



To Remove a Patient Link:

1 - Right click on the patient chart and select Patient Link

2 - Select the patient name in the Patient Links window and click Delete

Note: You cannot create a Partner link between a patient and a partner if a Patient link already exists. If the patient has '+Links' displayed beneath her cycle list you can quickly tell if it is a Patient link or a Partner link by right clicking on the patient chart and selecting Patient Link. If a name is displayed in the Patient Links window then a Patient link exists and will need to be removed first.



Creating Partner Link

Linking an already existing male patient as a partner to another patient record

Both females and males (patients and partners) can have patient charts in RESource. If you wish to add a partner record to a female chart, and the partner has an existing (male) chart you can simply create a link. This will link the charts and create a partner record in the patient chart.

To add a partner link:

- 1. Select the desired (female) patient in the Patient Explorer
- 2. Go to the Patient option in the main menu and select Partner
- 3. From the Partners window, click the **Pat/Part Link** button.

4. A Patient List window will appear with a list of eligible patients.

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- 5. Select the desired name from the list and click **OK**. This patient will now show up in the Partners window.
- 6. With the new partner selected, click the **Edit** button. You will notice that the name, SSN, DOB, Gender and any insurance information have been automatically filled in (according to what the partner has entered in his chart/patient record).

Note: If this partner is to be considered a sperm source (for Sperm Analysis purposes) the **Add Sperm Source** button should be clicked. For more information on Sperm Analyses refer to the 'Andrology' section.

Linking an new male patient as a partner to another patient record

To add a partner a new chart for the partner at the same time:

- 1. Select the desired (female) patient in the Patient Explorer
- 2. Go to the **Patient** option in the main menu and select **Partner**
- 3. From the Partners window, click the **New Pat/Part Link** button. This function creates a partner record for the selected patient, creates a chart for the partner (using the selected patient's demographic information), and links the patient and partner charts. This may be useful for quickly creating a male partner (i.e. Husband) record, plus chart, to an existing female patient.



If a partner record is part of a Pat/Part link, the font used in the demographic info of the partner will be greyed out.

Patients with more than one partner linked

When more than one partner is linked to a patient, they will both show when clicking the '+Links' button under the patient chart. The partner that is marked 'Active' in his chart will be highlighted green (see image below).
