Saving

Many operations in RESource, especially in the cycle and stim sheets, are in auto-save mode. In these cases there is no confirmation given that the data has been saved. For example, when an Srg event is entered in the stim sheet, it is saved automatically when closing the stim sheet. Note that you can also hit Ctrl+S to save data while still in the stim sheet. Other screens throughout RESource may contain OK or Save buttons, which will save the data.

Idle lockout screen

If the user is inactive in RESource for a set amount of time, the screen will lock and require a password to open. The time settings are_5, 10, 15, 30 minute settings. This is a site-wide option. The default setting is 'disabled' and can be set up by users with a certain permission level.

Mouse Clicks

There are several grids/tables in RESource that provide an edit button to view/edit detail on the selected row. Many grids will perform the same function by double clicking on the row. For example, if you double click on a row in a lab log a Lab Result window will appear displaying the details of the row. The stim sheet grid, however, processes mouse clicks according to the column selected. Double-clicking on a medication amount in the stim sheet will popup a detail screen for the medication, while double-clicking on the comment field will pop up a Zoom /Editor dialog for the comment.

Also, there are several places in RESource that provide a right-click pop-up style menu. This menu is accessed by a right-mouse click. For example, if a patient or cycle is selected in the Patient Explorer, a right-mouse click will popup the explorer menu. If a stim row is selected, then a right-mouse click will pop-up the stim menu.

Mouse Over Hints

Many fields, most notably fields on the stim sheet, also provide fly-over hints. Holding the mouse over any stim grid field will provide a better view of the field's contents in a fly-over window. For example, positioning the mouse pointer over a field containing a user's initials will reveal the users full name.

Many fields in RESource are either noted with user initials (comment fields) or require user initials to be entered (PROV column in stim sheet). The Who Is feature is an easy way to determine a user's full name by his/her initials. To access Who Is, go to the main toolbar and select Tools – Who Is. Choose to search by Initials, Last Name or First Name, enter your criteria and hit the Search button – any user meeting the criteria entered will appear.

Sorting Grids (table data)

Several RESource grids (tables) support sorting. To activate a sort simply click on the column header you would like to sort on. Clicking the column header again will reverse the sort. You can try this on the Lab Log grid by selecting Patient-Labs-Lab Log from the main menu.
